

# The Director's Corner



#### **HFHCI Empowering Families to Help Themselves**

Habitat for Humanity of Central Iowa (HFHCI) is a **partnership**, **not a giveaway program**. Our homeowner families **buy t**he homes that our affiliate builds and renovates. Habitat homeowners also invest hundreds of hours of their own labor (sweat equity) working alongside community volunteers. As a result, HFHCI houses are affordable to low-income families in our area. Habitat homeowners pay an affordable mortgage, receive financial education and help build their homes alongside volunteers.

Unwavering support from our donors and volunteers has assisted HFHCI in helping over 60 families secure decent, affordable housing. This includes **243 family members and 166 children**. Because of you, these families were able to obtain a safer place to sleep at night, along with the strength, stability and self-reliance they need to build better lives. But it's not enough. We need your support to build our impact. And with your help, we know we can do more.

Thanks to your financial support, HFHCI recently remodeled a home located at 401 16th Street in Eldora and also one located at 1228 Stafford in Ames. Construction just began on a new home at 3305 Morningside in Ames. We want to increase our builds and our numbers. We need your help.

Here at Habitat for Humanity of Central Iowa we know that a decent home provides the strength, stability and independence that families need. Becoming a homeowner provides a strong foundation and a sense of accomplishment. A decent, safe and affordable place to live transforms a family's life in other key ways as well, including: better health and safer living conditions, growth in many areas of child development, financial learning and responsibility, and community strength-with a chance to give back to our community. Increased family stability and economic mobility, a greater sense of dignity and civic pride, stronger and more vibrant communities that can attract and keep business and manufacturing — these are all connected to stable, decent, affordable housing.

Please consider giving financially to support our efforts in Hamilton, Hardin, and Story counties. Because of your generous donations many families in our communities can realize the dream of home ownership.
