We are excited to announce that we have two new home builds ready to begin. The first located on 10th street and generously donated by the Driscoll Family, and the second on Grand, a partnership with the City of Ames. The house designs have some new features thanks to Dan Nutini.

"Due to the rising costs of construction materials, we took the approach with these homes to try to be really efficient with the design and footprint. This will keep the homes affordable, yet still provide the necessary amenities and spaces that a family would expect to see in a new home. These homes will have 3 bedrooms, 2 full baths, full kitchen, living and entertaining space, an attached garage, and a front porch that will connect the home to the neighborhood. The total finished square feet of the homes is approximately 1,400. We are very excited to see these homes replace the dilapidated ones."-Dan Nutini

"The lady on the left is Reva Fisher(the original house owner). The lady on the right is Martha Driscoll. Thad is on the right and Eric is in the back with Eric's baby Jackson in Grandma's lap. Reva moved to Ames in the 1940s and was a single mother of 2. She rented and owned multiple houses throughout the years in Ames. She worked her way through school and became a nurse at the age of 55. Martha was a retired social worker who volunteered for the Red Cross and other community areas. Martha and Ron moved to Ames in about 2002, after Reva passed. Both myself and Eric are/were volunteer Firefighters. I personally attribute my ability to volunteer because of my Mom and my Grandma; both great examples of contributers to our society."
