My son earned his Bachelor of Fine Arts and then his Master of Arts and is employed as a Software Engineer. They were first in our family to earn college degrees! I have continued my employment with Iowa State University for nearly 30 years. This home has been a blessing to me and my family and I believe provided the stability and security that a single mother raising two young children needed nearly 25 years ago!
